Delivery Method:

Independent study using Google Classroom resources. Online support from your tutor.

You will be required to complete three online assignments (one assignment per unit) and an individual learning plan (ILP).

This qualification is designed for anyone wishing to progress to a wide range of further learning and job roles such as nursery staff, teachers, health/social workers across health and social care, children and young people, nursing, public services and education and training.

Entry requirements:

For a funded/part funded course, you must be aged 19+ on 31 August 2025 and a UK resident.
