Entry requirements:

There are no entry requirements with regards to prior qualifications or experience.

Delivery Method:

Face to face teaching sessions.

There will be no formal examination.

Progression route:

Progression routes from the Entry Level Award in Personal and Social Skills could include:

- Moving to the next Entry Level within Personal and Social Skills (e.g. Entry 1 on to Entry 2, or Entry 2 on to Entry 3)
- Other qualifications such as; Level 1 Award in Volunteering, Functional Skills English, Maths or Essential Digital Skills.
- Volunteering opportunities
